Planning for the future

When students are making course selections for grade 11, they will need to consider what their plans may be after they leave secondary school:

- Degree program at university (Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, etc)
- Certificate or diploma program (Tourism, Vet assistant, etc)
- Trades program (Welding, Carpentry, Electrician, Parts Technician, etc)
- Work

Now is a good time to start having discussions about these plans and researching post-secondary options.

The timeline for the course selection is as follows:

February 7 - 11

Ms. Holmes meets with students to outline how to make their course selections

Forms sent home with students for discussion with parents

February 16

All parent-signed forms to be returned to Ms. Holmes

February 16 - June

Timetable creation will begin

Courses used will be selected based on student requests

If staffing changes, timetable may change anytime before September

Sometime in June

Tentative student timetables for 2021-22 available to students and parents

A copy will be sent home with the final report card at the end of June

2. Using all lower case, user name is: firstname.lastname@student.sd73.bc.ca
3. Students have already changed their password and were told to record it
4. Select a subject area:

 - ii. Grade 11 - English, Math, Science, Socials, Other Electives, Other Alternates
 - iii. Grade 12 - English, Math, Other Electives, Other Alternates
